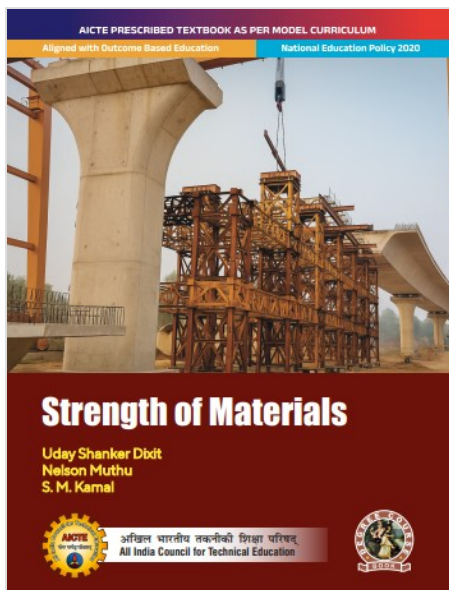




Strength of Materials

Strength of Materials This book on Strength of Materials follows so-called engineer's approach.
